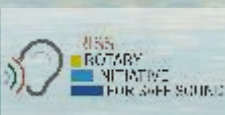
Dr.K.N. Raghavan, was born in Kochi, Kerala and had his schooling at Rajagiri High School, Kalamassery. He completed his MBBS from Calicut Medical College in 1988 and joined for post graduate studies in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Trivandrum Medical College. In 1989, he sat for the UPSC Civil Service Exam and joined Indian Revenue Service (Customs and Central Excise) in 1990. During the course of his career he has served as Assistant Commissioner of Central Excise at Hosur and Coimbatore (1992-1995), Dy. Director, Directorate of Revenue Intelligence, Calicut (1995-2000), Managing Director, Kerala Co-operative Rubber Marketing Federation (Rubbermark) and CEO, Co-operative Medical College, Cochin (2000-2004), Additional Commissioner of Customs, JNCH, Nhasasheva (2004-2007) and First Secretary (Commerce) in High Commission of India, Singapore (2007-2011) before returning to Cochin as Additional Commissioner of Central Excise and Service Tax in 2011. Subsequent to his promotion in June 2012, he worked as Commissioner of Customs at Cochin till February 2017. He served on a deputation to Govt of Kerala as CEO of NORKA ROOTS till October 2017. He was also hand-picked by the Govt of India for posting as the Commissioner of GST and Central Excise, Mumbai Central, Mumbai. Giving a ray of hope to the thousands of Rubber farmers, Dr Raghavan has taken over a month ago as the Chairman and Executive Director of Rubber Board.

Dr.K.N. Raghavan qualified to the Ranji Trophy panel of accredited umpires of BCCI in 1991 and to the All India Panel in 1996. He has umpired one One Day International (India Vs. Bangladesh at Mohali in 1998) on field and was third umpire in the India Vs. Australia One Day International match at Cochin in April, 1998. He was reserve umpire for three more One Day international matches. Besides, he has umpired numerous Ranji Trophy, Duleep trophy, Deodhar Trophy matches. He retired from the Umpires panel of BCCI in April, 2013.

The first book of Dr.K.N. Raghavan, 'World Cup Chronicle' was published in 1999. Second edition of the said book was published in 2003. His second book 'Dividing Lines - Contours of India- China Conflict' was published in August, 2012. His third book 'Vanishing Shangri La- History of Tibet and Dalai Lamas in 20th Century' was published in March, 2016.

I believe in the adage "failing to plan is planning to fail" - says DGE Shirish Kesavan

(Following is the excerpts of the interview Rtn M Kumaraswamy Pillai, Editor-RW had with DGE Rtn Shirish Kesavan, on the sidelines of Grant Management Seminar held at the Carmel College of Engineering, Punnapra. Royal Weeks profusely thank the DGE for opening up his mind on the priorities as the DG 3211. Enjoy reading)

RW: 1. Greetings from RC, Alleppey.

Hope you are poised for taking over as the DG of the RI district 3211 in a week's time and would have done sufficient home work to discharge the duties of the DG-2019-20.

SK: In Rotary, preparation and planning are very, very important, which is precisely the reason why the District Governors are elected before a minimum of two years. I believe in the adage "failing to plan is planning to fail". I have done my home work to the best of my abilities to take over the reins of our District.

RW2. The PETS organised for the President Elect and Secretary Elect at Grand Hyatt, Kochi this year was a totally different one for its ambience of the venue, sumptuous food and beverages etc.,. Apart from that how do you rate the "Vaikhari" as a training programme for the President and Secretary elects?

SK: For every training program, according to me, 3 aspects are important – Cerebral, Gastronomical and pulmonary. Cerebral relates to the intellectual content, Gastronomical means the food and beverages and, pulmonary aspect points to the warmth and cordiality with which the participants are welcomed into the program. In all the above aspects, "Vaikhari" was unparalleled in the annals of our District.

We had no less a Rotary leader than PRID Shekar Mehtha, who is a towering and charismatic Rotary leader, an Orator Par Excellence, a Business Mogul and much more, all rolled into one, as our Chief Guest and main speaker of the inaugural session, who had enlightened us on the RI theme "Rotary Connects the World." We had Rtn. Jorson Fernandez, PDG and ARFC, who is an ENT Surgeon by profession and a much sort after Trainer, as our in-house Guest Trainer. Apart from our PDGs, Orators like Venugopal C. Govind, Debasish Mishra and many others had led various training sessions. Playback Singers like Afsal, Akhila Entertained the participants. Therefore, I rate "Vaikhari" as a superb training program.

RW3 Last year we witnessed an unprecedented super floods in Kerala which was the worst ever happened in the past 100 years. The five revenue districts covered by our district 3211 were the worst hit areas. It was heartening to note that Rotarians all over the district took active part in the relief and rehabilitation programmes. In some areas the activities still continue. Do you have any plans to continue the rebuilding activities as a continuing project by joining with the Govt. of Kerala and other agencies?

SK: In terms of magnitude and intensity, the last year's flood was unprecedented in the chronicled history of our State. During the devastating flood, Rotarians of our District along with others had swung straight away into action, and the selfless service of Rotary caught the attention of the entire state of Kerala and also the national media, thereby increasing the image, prestige and appeal of Rotary manifold. The affected people are yet to recover fully. We have to continue, to the extent possible, the rebuilding activities, on our own as well as by joining other agencies.

RW 4: I profusely congratulate you for taking up the Waste Management as the district project in 2019-20 and coining a beautiful name REACH (Rotary Effective Action for Cleanliness and Hygiene). What I feel is that we have more role in creating awareness in schools and colleges about the need for maintaining cleanliness and hygiene. We can also think of dovetailing from the schemes like "Swatch Bharat Abhiyan" of Govt. of India. Comment.

SK: REACH is the acronym for Rotary Empowered Action for Cleanliness and Hygiene. If you go through the project details, which is already in the public domain among Rotarians, you will find that creating awareness among the public, including school and college students is one of the thrust areas of REACH Program. Unless we build a foundation in the mind of the public regarding the need for waste management and green protocol, no amount of effort will persuade them to engage in waste reduction and waste management activities. We have just one year ahead and, as our Government projects are usually delayed due to 'red tapism', adhocism and such other procedural hassles, which are time consuming, we have to use extra energy and initiative to implement the projects in a time bound manner. We have already initiated discussions with Haritha Keralam, Suchithwa Mission and other Government agencies, both State and Central, who will help us in advancing our REACH program. Our sole aim is to do as much as possible in furtherance of REACH and in reaching that goal, we will not consider anyone as untouchable.

RW 5: What are your plans for membership Development and what is your target for the year?

SK: Globally as well as in Districts, improving membership is one of the thrust areas of Rotary. In our District, our target is to achieve a membership strength of 6,500, thereby becoming the largest Rotary District in the Indian sub-continent. Revenue District wise, as per the last census, which was in 2011, the population, roughly, is as follows:-

Trivandrum : 33 lakhs, Kollam : 26.4 lakhs, Alleppey : 21.2 lakhs, Pathanamthitta : 12 lakhs, Kottayam : 19.79 lakhs Total : 112.39 lakhs

Now, the population in the above five Districts must have reached a minimum of 125 lakhs. But the membership strength of Rotary still hovers around a paltry 4500. Even after making allowance for quality and filtering, the proportion is abysmally low. If each club increases its membership strength by 15 on an aggregate and also succeed in preventing attrition, the above membership target is within our reach.

RW 6: Left to myself, more than Membership Development, retention of members is utmost important. How do you react and do you have any plans for retention?
SK: Insisting on weekly Rotary meetings, events intended to increase the involvement of Anns and Annets, including programs in meetings and seminars which have contemporary relevance and reducing the expenses are some of the plans I am contemplating for retention.

RW 7: Of late there is general feeling of the Rotarians participating in the district seminars that proper care is not taken in selecting the speakers and also allotting sufficient time to the speakers. Do you plan to make the seminars different?

SK: We are planning to reduce the number of speakers, insisting on quality speakers and provide adequate time to them to present their views and insights. We are also going to avoid crammed and hectic program schedules and make seminars more leisurely and enjoyable. Plans are also on the anvil to give the participants of seminars value for their time and money.

RW 8: What are the other avenues of service you would like to focus?

SK: Apart from District project and other continuing projects, I would like to focus on areas like palliative care, WinS, Happy Schools, Annadhanam, Asha Kiran, Inter-club projects and programs within the Rotary Districts and between Rotary Districts, Inter-Districts Rotarians Exchange Programs etc.

RW 9: Wish you all the best for a successful Rotary Year 2019-20. Please share your message for the readers of Royal Weeks
SK: Enjoy Rotary, develop a mind set to share your time, resources and other gifts to others also, especially those who are less fortunate than us
